Resurrection Roman Catholic Parish, located in the Cambria City section of Johnstown, became a new parish on July 22, 2009, formed from the merger of five ethnic Cambria City parishes: Immaculate Conception (German), SS. Casimir and Emerich (Polish and Hungarian), St. Columba (Irish), St. Rochus (Croatian) and St. Stephen (Slovak). Prior to the formation of Resurrection Parish, the parishes of St. Casimir and St. Emerich merged in 1997 to form Ss. Casimir and Emerich Parish.

The parish continues to honor its ethnic roots through music, art, food and crafts.

The Sacraments

Baptism

Arrangements for baptism are made with the pastor.

Reconciliation

Preparation for First Penance occurs within the regularly scheduled Religious Education Program as well as through additional preparation designed to ensure that the children are fully formed for the sacrament.

Eucharist

Preparation for First Communion occurs within the regularly scheduled Religious Education Program as well as through additional preparation designed to ensure that the children are fully formed for the sacrament.

Confirmation

The Confirmation formation program is part of the Religious Education Program. It begins in 9th grade and ends in 11th grade, when students make their Confirmation. For more information, contact the Director of Religious Education.

Marriage

Arrangements need to be made with the pastor nine months prior to the marriage. The pastor must confirm the wedding date and couples must complete the marriage preparation program. The Marriage Enrichment Committee provides a sponsor couple for the engaged couple.

Anointing of the Sick

The pastor will provide anointing for those who are experiencing illness and are in need of the sacrament. There is also a yearly Anointing Mass.

The Catechumenate/Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Those interested in coming fully into the Catholic faith are welcome to join the RCIA formation process. Qualified persons include those who have never been Catholic or those who have received one or two but not all three of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation).

Committees, Groups & Activities

Listed here are the various committees, groups, and activities of the parish.

Everyone is invited to get involved as best they can.

For a diagram of the reporting structure of the Pastoral Council's standing committees and other parish groups, see the middle insert of this booklet.

Activities Committee

The Activities Committee oversees a variety of fundraisers throughout the year, particularly our June Summer Festival and our participation in the Ethnic Festival.. The committee also maintains a parish-wide calendar of events, helping to coordinate planning among various groups and activities of the parish.

Adult Religious Education

The pastor regularly provides opportunities for adult education through scripture classes covering the Gospels and other books of the Bible as well as other topics. These sessions are preceded by an opportunity for prayer in the Church.

Bereavement Ministry

The Bereavement Ministry helps families who have lost a loved one to plan the readings and music for the funeral Mass. Members of this group also offer their time to fulfill the needed ministries at the Funeral Mass. Each family is offered a "companion," a member of the ministry who provides ongoing emotional support to families for one year after the death of their loved one.

Book Review

The Parish Book Review seeks to provide ongoing spiritual and faith development to all parishioners through review and discussion of relevant books, films and other resources.

Catholic Education Support Group

The purpose of the Catholic Education Support Group is to provide tuition assistance

to members who children are attending Catholic school or CCD classes, elementary or secondary, in the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese. Members and students receiving tuition assistance need to be registered members of the parish. Members need not have children attending Catholic schools.

Cemetery Committee

The Cemetery Committee advises the pastor on decisions regarding the care and upkeep of the parish's six cemeteries (Immaculate Conception, St. Casimir, St. Columba, St. Emerich, St. Rochus and St. Stephen). The Cemetery Manager helps to organize and maintain cemetery records and aids in seeking qualified contractors for cemetery services.

Communications Committee

The Communications Committee helps to convey important parish information to parishioners and the broader community regarding activities within our parish. This committee serves as the parish's link to the outside media, takes responsibility for developing parish-related informational booklets, and assumes responsibility for the parish's web site.

Cursillo

Cursillo is an international movement , which began in Spain after the First World War when Mass attendance by men was in decline. The Catholic Action group sought to reverse this decline. Seeking to bring about a more profound change in the day-to-day life of faith communities, the founders led a three-day Cursillo. Following this retreat, they continued the practices of spiritual direction and small-group meetings which had proven to be fruitful and also met in the larger community to witness to the transformative actions in their lives. First-time participants in the Cursillo program embark with a small number of other individuals on a three-day retreat led by a spiritual director. Faith and community formation continues after the Cursillo weekend as Cursillistas, as they are now known, meet weekly for prayer and discussion in gatherings known as group meetings and Ultreya.

Education Committee

The Education Committee develops parish days of reflection and renewal for the liturgical seasons of Advent and Lent as well as programs and presentations by internal and external presenters to enrich faith, increase knowledge and build the parish faith community.

Eucharistic Adoration

An opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration is offered regularly for parishioners to spend time in the presence of the Lord in quiet reflection. Adoration is often followed by Evening Prayer.

Finance Council

The Finance Council is a parish committee mandated by Church law. Members provide input to help the pastor in making financial decisions for the parish on such matters as parish property, cemeteries, personnel, obligations to the Diocese, building and maintenance funding and special needs.

Heritage Preservation

The Heritage Preservation Coordinator, along with additional advisors, works with the pastor and various parish committees and groups to ensure preservation of, and opportunities for participation in, the six separate ethnic traditions at the root of the merger that created Resurrection Parish (Immaculate Conception—German, SS. Casimir and Emerich—Polish and Hungarian, St. Columba—Irish, St. Rochus—Croatian and St. Stephen—Slovak).

Holy Name Society

The Holy Name Society traces its roots to the Council of Lyons in 1274. At a time of great heresy and blasphemy, Pope Gregory X wrote to (Blessed) John of Vercelli, Master General of the Dominican Order, asking that the order help spread reverence for the name of Jesus and encourage humility and devotion when entering the house of God, our Churches. The order did so, and devotion spread rapidly throughout Europe. Today the society is an international Catholic spiritual organization for lay and reli-

gious over the age of 18. The group is devoted to defending the holy names and practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Once a month, the members of our parish Holy Name Society assist with a Coffee & Doughnuts social after the Sunday Masses.

Knights of Columbus

In 1881, 29-year-old Father Michael J. McGivney called together men of his parish for a meeting. The group “vowed to be defenders of their country, their families and their faith.” Looking to the impact of Christopher Columbus through whom Christianity was brought to the New World, the group formed a fraternal society, incorporated in 1882 as the Knights of Columbus. Today the world’s largest Catholic family fraternal service organization, it provides programs of evangelization and Catholic education and promotes civic involvement and aid to those in need as well as a life insurance program for widows and orphans of deceased members. Membership is open to Catholic men 18 years of age and older.

Ladies’ Auxiliary

The Ladies’ Auxiliary is open to the women of the parish. This group provides support for the efforts of the Church as it serves the needs of both the parish faith community in particular and the local community in general. The Ladies’ Auxiliary provides this support through spiritual, social, educational, and fund raising activities.

Liturgical Ministries

The parish welcomes those wishing to serve in the lay liturgical ministries of the Church. These include altar server, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, lector, cantor, choir member, and hospitality minister. For those wanting to become involved in a new ministry, training is available. All laity are encouraged to actively participate in the liturgical life of the Church.

Liturgy Committee

The Liturgy Committee works with the pastor to determine special themes, education and decorations for liturgical seasons and special liturgical celebrations.

Marriage Enrichment Ministry

The Marriage Enrichment Ministry works with the pastor to hold a special yearly Celebration of Marriage Mass and Dinner. Sponsors from the ministry guide and support couples who are engaged and preparing for marriage and continue to support them throughout their first year of marriage.

Men's Morning of Prayer

Each month, the pastor facilitates a Men's Morning of Prayer for men of the parish to discuss scriptural readings for upcoming Mass celebrations and to share their faith.

Music Ministry

The Music Ministry is part of the parish's liturgical ministry team. This ministry encompasses a music director, organists, cantors, and choir members as well as instrumentalists for special occasions.

Parish Family Life Committee

The Parish Family Life Committee develops and coordinates activities intended to build the Resurrection Parish family and individual families of the parish. The committee works on projects related to social justice; ministry to the homebound and sick; and fellowship opportunities through special dinners and events.

Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council serves as an advisory body to the pastor. The council discusses and makes recommendations to the pastor on a wide variety of matters related to the parish, including ideas and concerns from parishioners, future direction for the parish and decision-making on various needs.

The standing committees of the Pastoral Council are: Activities, Cemetery, Communications, Education, Liturgy, Parish Family Life, Planning, and Properties & Maintenance. There is also a Finance Council Liaison, a Heritage Preservation Coordinator and Youth Representatives who participate in the council meetings.

Planning Committee

Parish planning is a prayerful and participative process through which our parish evaluates itself as a Faith Community. This is achieved by reflecting on our roots, assessing our current strengths and weaknesses, and then envisioning the possibilities for the future. This continuing process includes the evaluation of all facets of parish life, namely spirituality, education, staffing, facilities, demographics, and financial stability. These activities are carried out by this committee, remembering our call to conversion and holiness.

Properties and Maintenance Committee

The Properties and Maintenance Committee has been instrumental in helping the pastor with the transition from five separate parishes and their accompanying properties and maintenance to a single parish with consolidated properties and upkeep. The committee works with parish staff and outside contractors to perform repairs and on-going maintenance and upgrade of parish properties.

The Catechumenate/Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The parish RCIA group reflects the mission of the RCIA process within the universal Church. Formaters (those who help to form the people) meet regularly with those who wish to become full members of the Catholic Church. Along with the pastor, they help candidates to learn more about the teachings of the Catholic faith and to engage in the celebration of the liturgy and parish family life in preparation for their full entry into the church, usually at the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

Reconnecting with Your Catholic Faith

The Reconnecting with Your Catholic Faith group, the parish's response to the Catholic Church's *Come Home* program, provides a supportive, listening environment for those who are considering a return to their Catholic faith. Facilitators from the group meet regularly with those wishing to return, helping them to make the transition back to the Church and to participation in a faith community.

Religious Education for Youth

The parish's Religious Education program includes religious formation of students

within the CCD program (grades 1-8) and the Confirmation program (grades 9-11). Classes are held in the Parish Center. Formation includes class time and attendance at some Wednesday evening Masses throughout the year. Students have the opportunity during these Masses to participate in the various liturgical ministries.

Sewing Ministry

The Sewing Ministry assists with various needs within the parish and in the community by making Church decorations for special liturgical seasons and celebrations, making blankets for the sick and needy, creating banners, repairing liturgical garments and engaging in fundraising projects.

Women's Morning of Prayer

Each month, the pastor facilitates a Women's Morning of Prayer for women of the parish to discuss scriptural readings for upcoming Mass celebrations and to share their faith.

You'll Also Want to Know About . . .

Book of Intentions

To make our needs known for prayer, a special Book of Intentions is available on the stand near the confessional. All are welcome to write petitions in this book, submit them via the parish prayer chain, or post them on our web site. The Book of Intentions is brought forward during the Offertory Procession at each Mass and placed on the altar so that these prayers may be especially remembered during the Mass.

Blessed Blankets

Blessed Blankets made by the parish Sewing Ministry are always available in the Parish Office and may be picked up for a loved one who may be sick or otherwise in need. There is no charge for these blankets.

Communion to the Homebound

The pastor and a team of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion take Communion to the homebound. If you or a parishioner you know are in need of this ministry, please call the Parish Office.

Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown

Resurrection Parish is one of more than 80 parishes within the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown. The Diocese serves an eight-county area. The parish works with the Diocese to share important liturgical celebrations and education, to aid in raising funds for key Diocesan and mission projects through the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) and to support religious and other vocations. Funerals

Our pastor and members of our Bereavement Ministry help families with the necessary arrangements for a loved one's funeral.

Having Trouble with the Stairs? Use the Lift.

Resurrection Parish is pleased to offer accommodation to those who may have difficulty negotiating steps. The passenger lift, located on the Fourth Avenue side of the Church, may be used to enter both the Church and the Church Hall.

Mass Intentions

To schedule a Mass intention for a loved one, either in remembrance or in recognition of a special milestone currently occurring in someone's life, simply call the Parish Office.

Nursing Home Masses

Our pastor celebrates Mass at a few area nursing homes each month. If you wish to attend with a loved one, visit the parish website and click on the Events Calendar link

to see scheduled times or call the Parish Office.

Oratory and Oratory Hall

The Oratory is the former St. Rochus church building, located at the corner of Eighth Avenue and Chestnut Street. The upper level is a meeting space that can be used for lectures, prayer services, and as a classroom. The lower level offers additional space for meetings as well as having a fully equipped kitchen.

Parish Logo

From the formation of our parish, the Pastoral Council chose a logo to help solidify our identity. This symbol is based on the stylized word *Resurrection*. Within the word, the letter "t" has been elongated to form both a cross (the source of our salvation) and an anchor (a Christian sign of hope). Through the suffering and death of Jesus, and by his Resurrection, we affirm our hope of eternal life. Below the word Resurrection, between two horizontal lines, we identify ourselves as a Roman Catholic Parish.



Penance Services

Resurrection Parish works in conjunction with the Diocese and other area parishes to offer special penance services during the seasons of Advent and Lent to ensure that the faithful have the opportunity to participate in this sacrament.

Prayer Chain

The parish has a prayer chain to facilitate the communication of prayer needs within the parish and beyond. Requests can be made by contacting one of the prayer chain coordinators, directly on our web site, or by emailing the parish's webmaster at prayerrequest@resurrectionparishjohnstown.com

Resurrection Annex

Resurrection Annex, the former St. Casimir School, serves as the parish warehouse. It is located at the corner of Chestnut Street and Fifth Avenue.

Resurrection Parish Picnic Grove

The Resurrection Parish Picnic Grove is used for special parish events and is also available for rental by parishioners and those in the broader community. For information regarding the Grove, contact the parish manager at the Parish Office.

St. Anastasia Hall

St. Anastasia Hall, the former St. Rochus Convent, is located at 317 Chestnut Street, adjacent to the Oratory. This site is home to the Sweet Shoppe, the sewing ministry, and the Knights of Columbus.

Sanctuary Light

In addition to special Mass intentions, those who wish to honor the memory of a loved one or to mark a significant current milestone for a family member or friend can do so by requesting that the Sanctuary Light located by the tabernacle be lit in that person's honor. Requests can be made by contacting the Parish Office.

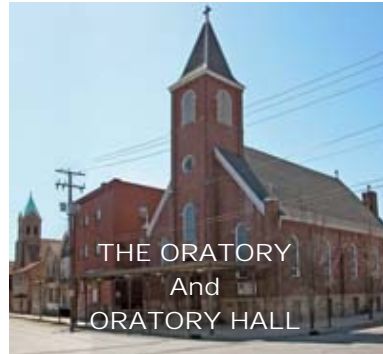
Sweet Shoppe

Homemade chocolate candy is available to parishioners and the community from the parish's Sweet Shoppe. The staff at the Sweet Shoppe makes decorative chocolates to help celebrate various special seasons and occasions, including Easter, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Halloween, and Thanksgiving. General operating hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. In the months prior to Christmas and Easter, Saturday hours are added from 9:00 AM until 1:00 PM. The Sweet Shoppe closes shortly after Easter and remains closed during the summer months.

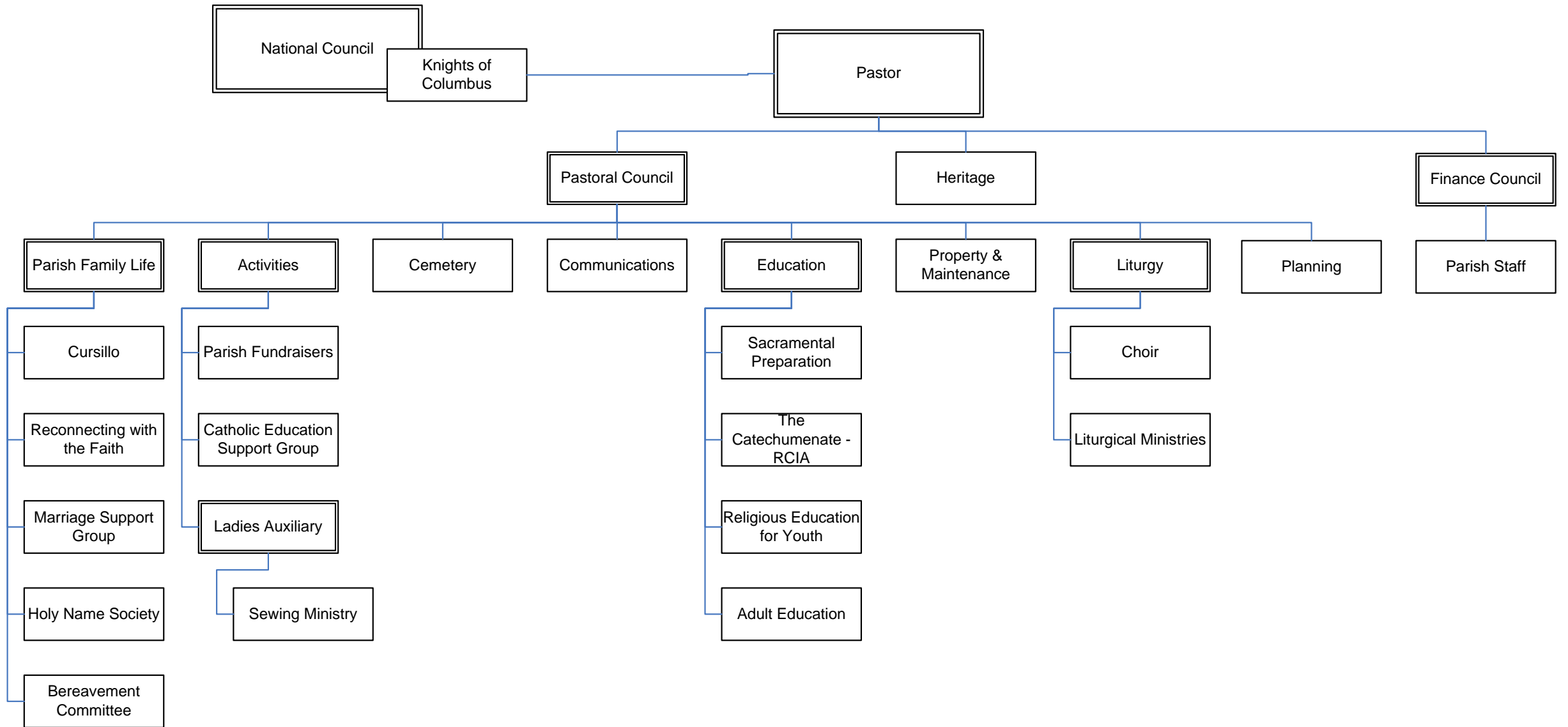

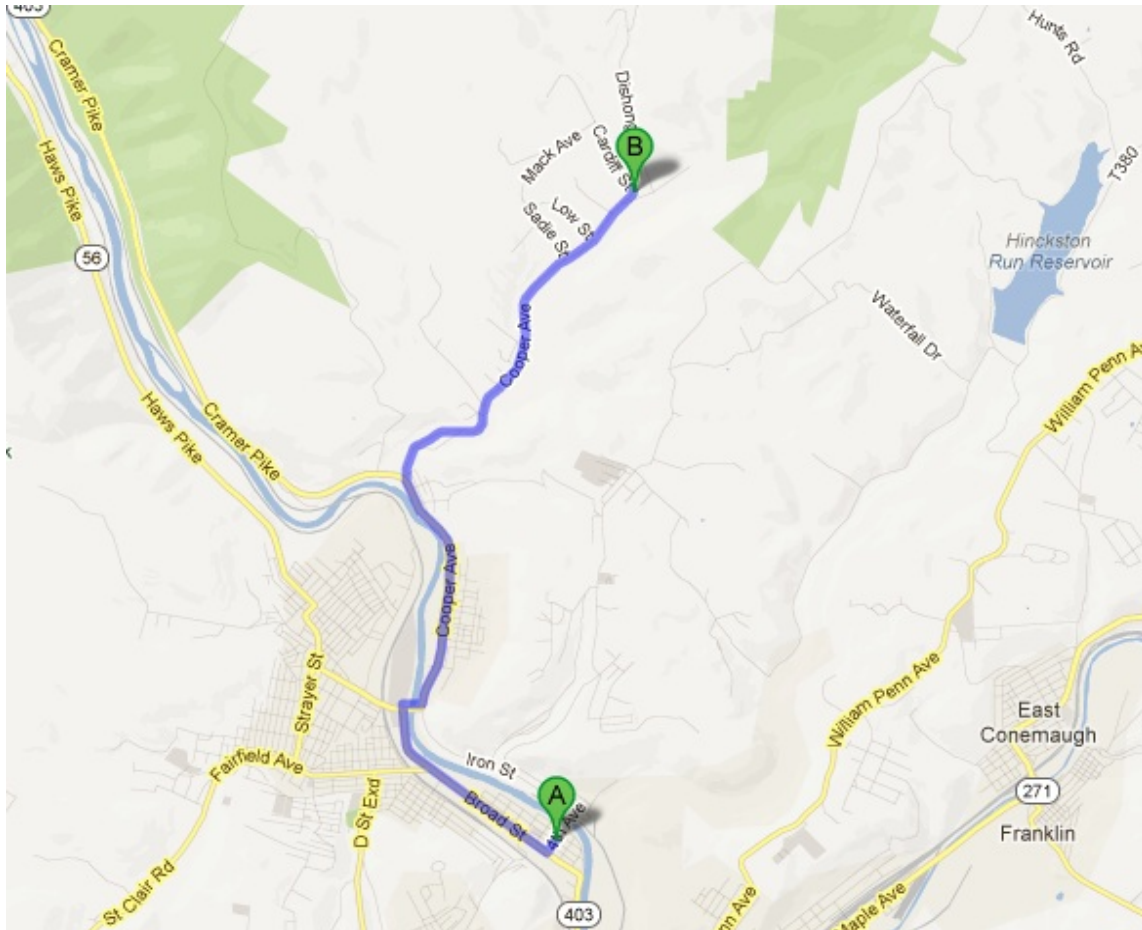

Resurrection Parish's Committee Structure

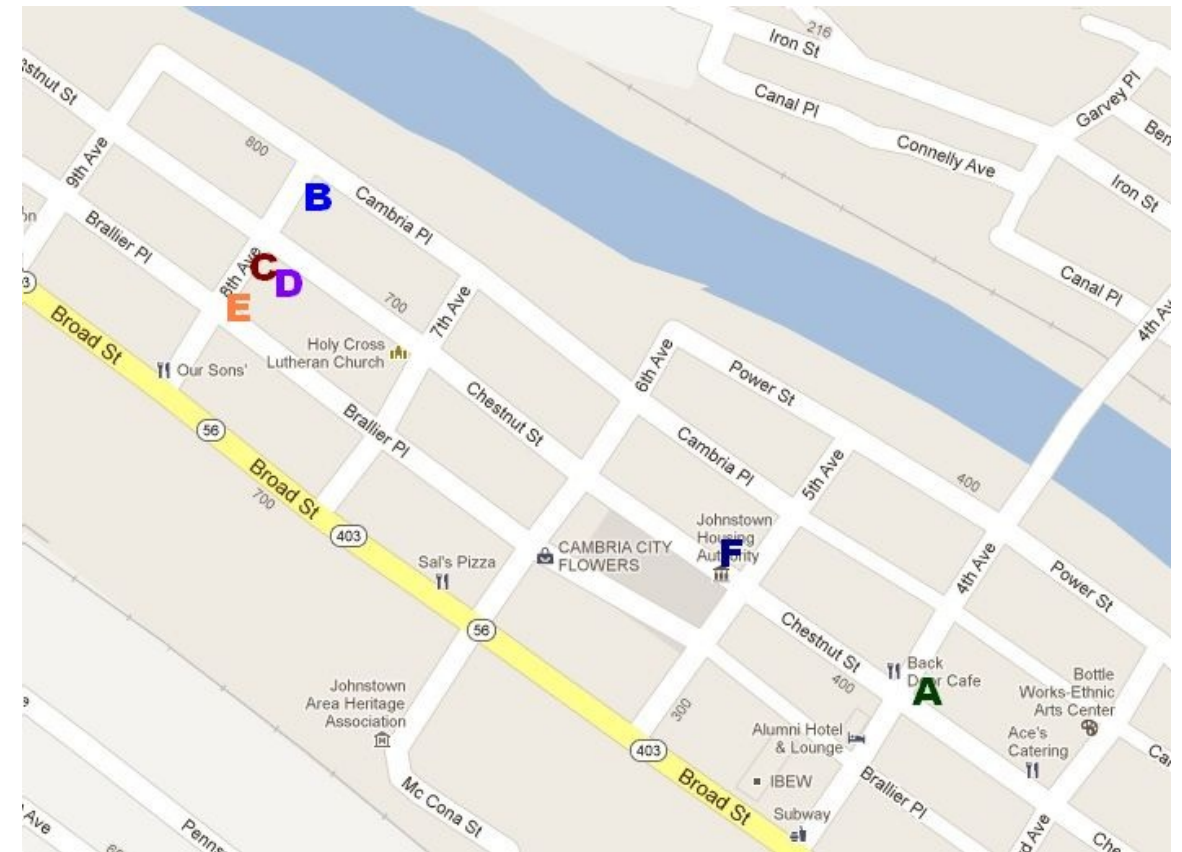


Directions from Resurrection Church to Resurrection Picnic Grove



Upon leaving Resurrection Church (A), travel to Broad Street (Route 403 North) and turn right. Continue on Route 403 for two miles; Broad Street will turn onto Laurel Avenue, which then will turn onto Cooper Avenue. Continue on Cooper Avenue until you see the signs for the Picnic Grove (B). Approximately one mile before reaching the picnic grove, Cooper Avenue veers to the right, leaving Route 403.
